What is the Young Women's Advisory Group?

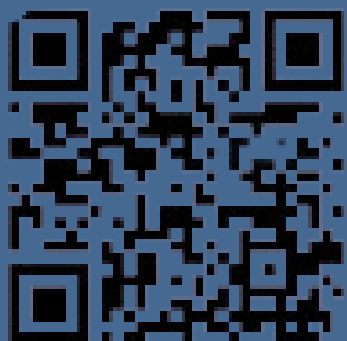
A safe and respectful space for women with experience of oppressive systems to discuss, develop and influence changes to Abianda and other organisations that work with young women and girls.
